In 2009, the annual Goffstown Open Studio Tour had changed to become our premier event, Uncommon Art on the Common, allowing more artists from a greater area to participate. The concentration of exhibitors on the Common and along Main Street provides greater ease for our visitors to experience a broad range of creative endeavors, as well as explore our excellent local eateries and shops. Since our beginning, Uncommon Art has grown and become a much-loved summer tradition in the Village. We enjoy a mix of perennial favorite artists and makers, as well as talented newcomers.
